We are a united voice for our special needs children in the Framingham Public Schools. Please reach out to our officers with your questions and concerns about special education. Periodically we meet with the Director of Special Education to discuss issues, both positive and negative, and concerns about special education in our district. We compile the list together and present it to the Director of Special Education and the Superintendent, as needed. Please let us know what is happening in the district. We will keep your information anonymous. We do not represent individual children, but come together as a united group in order to better the programs and services for all of our children.

We offer events of interest to parents and guardians including Basic Rights in Special Education. We have offered presentations on Lively Letters, Safety and Bullying Workshop, presentation on the districtwide New Inclusion Model, PARCC, etc. Many of the handouts from past presentations can be found on our website under 'events'.

Our Parent Outreach Committee runs a parent support group. Join our monthly parent/guardian support group also known as the 4Cs support group (Coffee, Comfort, Conversation and Chocolate) every second Friday from 9 to 11AM at B Sisters Cafe, 680 Worcester Road in Framingham on the east bound side of route 9 across the street from Staples, Trader Joes and Walgreens.
